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SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING SECTIONS 4-63, 4-64, 4-65  
AND 4-68 OF ARTICLE III OF CHAPTER 4 OF THE RANTOUL CODE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF  
THE VILLAGE OF RANTOUL, ILLINOIS, as follows:

**Section 1. Adoption.** Section 4-63, entitled "Authorization for sale at retail during special event; classification, terms and fees", Section 4-64, entitled "Services of catering establishment", Section 4-65, entitled "Applications for temporary permit", and Section 4-68, entitled "Automatic revocation upon revocation of consent by owner", of Article III, entitled "TEMPORARY PERMITS", of Chapter 4, entitled "ALCOHOLIC BEVRAGES", of the Rantoul Code, as supplemented and amended, be and the same are hereby further supplemented and amended as set forth in the title, headings and text thereof as attached hereto and hereby incorporated herein by this reference thereto.

**Section 2. Effective Date.** The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective immediately following its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

**Section 3. Conflict.** All other ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.


**Section 4. Publication.** The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause this Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form.

Sec. 4-63. - Authorization for sale at retail during special event; classification, terms and fees.

A temporary permit issued pursuant to this section shall authorize the sale at retail during a special event of any alcoholic liquor by the drink for consumption on the premises designated in such temporary permit or in original package form for consumption off the premises and not for resale in any form. Such temporary permits shall be classified and shall be subject to such terms, conditions, restrictions and fees as follows:

(1) *Class T-1 permit.*

- a. A class T-1 permit may be issued to any duly constituted educational, fraternal, political, civic, religious or other nonprofit organization other than a club for certain premises located in any zoning district other than any residential district established under and pursuant to the zoning ordinance, as supplemented and amended from time to time.
- b. A class T-1 permit may be issued for any specified period of time of not to exceed two consecutive days.
- c. Any authorized organization shall not be issued more than three class T-1 permits in any calendar year.
- d. The fee for each class T-1 permit shall be in the amount determined from time to time by the village board.

(2) *Class T-2 permit.*

- a. A class T-2 permit may be issued to the holder of any valid class A, general retail license, class GC, golf course license or any class R, restaurant license issued by the village under this chapter for any premises immediately adjacent to and extending no more than 100 feet from the licensed premises described in the then-current class A, general retail license, class GC, golf course license or class R, restaurant license so issued.
- b. A class T-2 permit may be issued for any specified period of time of not to exceed eight consecutive hours.
- c. Any holder of any class A, general retail license, class GC, golf course license or any class R, restaurant license shall not be issued more than one class T-2 permit per month for up to a maximum of six months during the term of any such class A, general retail license, class GC, golf course license or class R, restaurant license.
- d. The fee for any class T-2 permit shall be in the amount determined from time to time by the village board.

(3) *Class T-3 permit.*

- a. A class T-3 permit may be issued to the holder of any valid class A, general retail license under this chapter to sell or offer for sale any alcoholic liquor at any public special event which has been authorized, sanctioned or otherwise permitted by the village on any village-owned or controlled property or any public right-of-way; provided that such holder of a class A, general retail license shall procure and maintain dram shop liability coverage in maximum coverage limits in which the insurance carrier agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless both such licensee and the village from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of any such sale or transfer of alcoholic liquor.
- b. A class T-3 permit may be issued for any period of time not to exceed the duration of a special event.
- c. Not more than three class T-3 permits may be issued in connection with the same special event.
- d. The fee for each class T-3 permit shall be in the amount determined from time to time by the village board.

(4) *Class T-4 permit.*

- a. A class T-4 permit may be issued to any person who is the sponsor of a special event on any private property, provided that any such sponsor shall procure and maintain dram shop liability coverage in maximum coverage limits in which the insurance carrier agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless such sponsor and the owner of such private property from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of any such sale or transfer of alcoholic liquor.
- b. A class T-4 permit may be issued for any specified period of time not to exceed the duration of the special event.
- c. Any sponsor of a special event shall not be issued more than one class T-4 permit in connection with any two (2) such special events.
- d. The fee for each class T-4 permit shall be in the amount determined from time to time by the village board.

(5) *Class T-5 permit.*

- a. A class T-5 permit may be issued to any person who is granted the right by the sponsor of a special event on private property to sell or offer for sale any alcoholic liquor at such special event; provided that such person shall procure and maintain dram shop liability coverage in maximum coverage limits in which the insurance carrier agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless both such permittee and the owner of such private property from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of any such sale or transfer of alcoholic liquor.
- b. A class T-5 permit may be issued for any period of time not to exceed the duration of a special event.
- c. Not more than three class T-5 permits may be issued in connection with the same special event.
- d. The fee for each class T-5 permit shall be in the amount determined from time to time by the village board.

Sec. 4-64. – Services of catering establishment.

None of the foregoing provisions with respect to any temporary permit shall prevent any person having a class T-1 permit or class T-4 permit from employing the services of a catering establishment for the retail sale or transfer of alcoholic liquor at any such special event.

Sec. 4-65. - Applications for temporary permit.

The application for any such temporary permit shall be submitted to the local liquor control commissioner at least 21 days prior to the first day of any such special event. All applications for any such temporary permit shall state in writing:

- (1) A description of the special event, including the date and hours of the special event and the date and hours during which alcoholic liquor is proposed to be sold or transferred;
- (2) The limits of the premises or area where any such alcoholic liquor is proposed to be sold or transferred;
- (3) The measures to be taken by the applicant to ensure that persons under the age of 21 years will not be served, offered or allowed to possess any alcoholic liquor and that any public nuisance will not be created;
- (4) In connection with any class T-1 permit, class T-2 permit, class T-4 permit or class T-5 permit, if the proposed permit includes any premises or area not beneficially owned or duly leased or licensed by the applicant for the full period for which such temporary permit is to be issued, the

application shall include a signed statement by the owner of the proposed premises or area that the owner has freely and fully consented to the issuance of such a temporary permit and that the owner shall not revoke such consent during the full period for which the temporary permit may be issued without first advising the local liquor commissioner in writing of such revocation.

Sec. 4-68. - Automatic revocation upon revocation of consent by owner.

Any class T-1 permit, class T-2 permit, class T-4 permit or class T-5 permit issued under this article shall automatically be suspended during any time or period in which an owner of such premises has revoked consent to the issuance of the temporary permit as required herein. Such suspension shall be effective immediately upon receipt of written notice to the village or the local liquor control commissioner of the revocation or withdrawal of such consent by any such owner.
